TERRITORIAL ACKNOWLEGMENT

Chi Miigwetch to the Chippewas of Nawash for the insightful, considered and generous support in helping Georgian Bluffs craft this Territorial Acknowledgment.

Deeply rooted. Sustainably growing. – When we reflect on these words, we acknowledge and honour that these lands and waters, have deep roots stretching back tens of thousands of years, and are formed by geologic processes millions of years in the making.

When we reflect on these lands, the creatures that call this home, and the history of humans sharing this landscape with them, we acknowledge with respect and humility the history of First Nations who have lived sustainably with the land and water for many thousands of years.

When we look toward the continued growth of communities on these lands, we must ensure that this is done so with sustainability; to the plants, animals and wildlife that call these lands and water home, with whom we must learn to share this environment. We must also look to sustained growth in our relationship with the Chippewas of Nawash and the Chippewas of Saugeen, collectively known as the Saugeen Ojibway Nation, on whose territory we reside.

In the spirit of reconciliation, we acknowledge with respect, the history and living culture of the Anishinaabek: The People of the Three Fires known as Ojibway, Odawa, and Pottawatomi Nation, who have inhabited this land from time immemorial. We recognize that these lands are the territories of the Chippewas of Saugeen and the Chippewas of Nawash, collectively known as the Saugeen Ojibway Nation, the keepers of this land.

Georgian Bluffs is located on lands encompassed by Treaties 45 ½, 67, 72, 82, and 93. We reflect on our role as Treaty People and, the need to live in respect and peace and show respect to the first peoples who inhabit these lands and waters.

This is a place that values sustainable growth, investing in the infrastructure, opportunities, and people who will carry this vision forward.





Every interaction with us should exemplify service delivery, and we should establish clear expectations around that service, and meet or exceed them. Communication is a critical role for Georgian Bluffs, and we should provide as many opportunities as possible for you to engage and build relationships

Continue to improve how residents can **engage** and how we **communicate** with the public by developing and implementing, a **communications strategy** to align physical and digital communications, a revised **branding strategy,** and seeking to support and grow **public engagement** and participation opportunities.

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ENHANCING ENVIRONMENT & INFRASTRUCTURE: BUILDING FOR TODAY AND TOMORROW

Infrastructure supports our ability to connect and move through the municipality. The core services of the township include looking to maintain bridges, roads and facilities, and to look to the future in managing stormwater, water and wastewater, as well as plan and support sustainable growth. All of this must be done with a focus on the unique landscape and environment within which we operate.

Complete and maintain the Townships **Asset Management Plan** and from this develop comprehensive **10-year asset renewal** and replacement programs for **Bridges, Roads and Fleet**, as well as in other areas.

Complete a Facilities Master Plan to

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identify community and operational needs for Township facilities, existing and future **challenges and opportunities** and implement a **capital upgrade and replacement program** to deliver on the priorities of the Facilities Master Plan.

Continue to plan for sustainable growth and development in the Township through regular reviews of the Official Plan, the Zoning Bylaw and planning for future servicing of water and wastewater, stormwater planning and roads through Secondary Planning for East Linton.

Ensure that in all we do, we are planning for and addressing the impacts of **Climate Change** through implementing Committed to Change, through supporting **Green Development Standards**, seeking to invest in **renewable energy** to offset Township uses and providing **leadership** to community in ways to reduce climate impacts.
